#### PIANO TECHNIQUE TOURNAMENT RULES

Technique Tournament is a non-competitive event in which students are critiqued and rated on their technical skills. A student may enter any level. From that level the student is required to play three scales, three matching arpeggios, and one etude. Students may enter at any level and repeat levels at the teacher's discretion.

The Technique Tournament seeks to foster sequenced technical development in piano students. Each Technique Tournament level lists a set of keys with specific requirements for performance of scales and arpeggios.

**SCALES:** The student will play three scales. Two scales should be selected from those marked "Choice". One scale will be <u>drawn at random</u> from the list of scales for the level. All scales will be played with the metronome at the speed specified or faster. (Metronome is not required for the Preparatory A & B.) Unless noted otherwise, all scales will be played ascending and descending, hands together, parallel motion. Judges will allow two tries if the student requests them and will also permit several preliminary ticks of the metronome.

**ARPEGGIOS**: Matching arpeggios are played for each of the three scales with the requirements as indicated.

**ETUDES:** One is to be chosen. Memorization is not required. Metronome is required for Levels I and above. Teachers should use the metronome marking indicated in the music or choose a similar speed which is challenging, but comfortable, for the student. Fingering should be observed, but alterations marked in the music will be accepted. The selection should be played musically and ritardandos may be observed. Selection must be at least 16 measures in length. Prep level students may choose shorter pieces if needed.

**SCORES:** Students must play from a published score or a license download of the music. Measures numbers must be printed or handwritten.

**AWARDS:** Students will receive written comments, a certificate of proficiency if all requirements are met, and a special award if the performance receives a Superior rating.

#### PREPARATORY A

No metronome is required at this level, but it may be used.

**SCALES**: Option 1: Five-note scales for F C G D A E Major, hands separately or together.

<u>Choice:</u> one from F C G and one from D A E, <u>hands together.</u>

Option 2: Five-note scales for F C G D A E Minor, hands separately or together.

<u>Choice</u>: one from F C G Minor and one from D A E minor, <u>hands together</u>.

**ARPEGGIOS:** 2 octaves, hand-over-hand, ascending or ascending and descending.

#### **ETUDES:**

Option 1: Your choice of any solo or etude which utilizes one or more of the following skills:

- Patterns of five-note scales
- Block or broken triad chords
- Cross-over arpeggios
- Displacement of patterns for extended use of the keyboard
- Staccato and legato touches

#### Option 2: Choice of an Etude Resource:

#### PREPARATORY B

No metronome is required at this level, but it may be used.

- **SCALES**: Option 1: Major scales for F C G D A E, 1 or 2 octaves, hands separately or together. <u>Choice:</u> one from F C G and one from D A E, <u>hands together.</u>
  - Option 2: Minor scales for F C G D A E, 1 or 2 octaves, hands separately or together.

    <u>Choice</u>: one from F C G Minor and one from D A E, minor, <u>hands together.</u>

**ARPEGGIOS:** 2 octaves, hand-over-hand, ascending and descending. Or

1 octave, ascending & descending, hands separately or together. Or

2 octaves, ascending & descending, hands separately or together.

#### **ETUDES:**

Option 1: Your choice of any solo or etude which utilizes one or more of the following skills:

- Two or more 5-note scale positions.
- Extension to a 6<sup>th</sup> in either or both hands.
- Use of thumb-turns or unusual patterns to extend range of keys
- Arpeggiated passages
- Shifts between I, IV, and V chord positions.
- Extended use of keyboard, 2 or more octave shifts.
- Staccato and legato touches, 2-note slurs.
- Balance between hands.

#### LEVEL I

Metronome is required.

**SCALES**: Keys of F C G D A E B Major and A D E minor, 2 octaves, = 72, hands separately or together, ascending and descending.

<u>Choice</u>: One major and one minor from above, hands together,  $\sqrt{\phantom{a}} = 72$ .

**ARPEGGIOS:** 2 octaves, hands separately or together, ascending and descending. **NO** metronome required.

#### **ETUDES:**

Option 1: Your choice of any solo or etude which utilizes one or more of the following skills:

- Major and/or minor scales.
- Chromatic patterns.
- Alberti bass patterns.
- Arpeggiated patterns.
- Parallel, contrary and oblique motion.
- Combinations of various articulations and touches.
- Balance between the hands.

#### Option 2: Choice from the Etude Resource List (See p. 5)

• Choose any etude from the <u>Etude Resource List</u> which utilizes the appropriate technique and musicality skills required at the early intermediate level or higher.

#### LEVEL II

Metronome is required.

**SCALES**: Keys of F C G D A E B F<sup>#</sup> C<sup>#</sup> Major and A D E B minor, 2 or 4 octaves, = 80 or = 40, hands together, ascending & descending.

Choice: One major and one minor from above, hands together, = 80 (40).

**ARPEGGIOS:** 2 octaves, hands together, ascending & descending,  $\Box = 60$ .

**ETUDES:** Your choice of any solo or an etude from the <u>Etude Resource List</u> (See p. 5) which utilizes the appropriate technique and musicality skills required at the intermediate level or higher.

#### **LEVEL III**

Metronome is required.

SCALES: Keys of F C G F\*C\* Bb Eb Ab Db Major and F C G minor, 3 octaves, = 80 or 4 octaves, = 60, hands together ascending and descending.

Choice: One major and one minor from above, hands together, = 80 (40).

**ARPEGGIOS:** 3 octaves, hands together, ascending and descending. 4 octaves, = 46.

**ETUDES:** Your choice of any solo or an etude from the <u>Etude Resource List</u> (See p.5) which utilizes the appropriate technique and musicality skills required at the late intermediate level or higher.

#### LEVEL IV

Metronome is required.

**SCALES**: Keys of D A E B Major and D A E B F<sup>#</sup> C<sup>#</sup> G<sup>#</sup> B<sup>b</sup> E<sup>b</sup> minor, 4 octaves, = 80. <u>Choice</u>: One major and one minor beginning on a black key, = 80.

**ARPEGGIOS:** 4 octaves, hands together, ascending and descending, = 60.

**ETUDES:** Your choice of any solo or an etude from the <u>Etude Resource List</u> (See p. 5) which utilizes the appropriate technique and musicality skills required at the late intermediate level or advanced level.

#### CHALLENGE LEVEL

SCALES: Keys of C G D A E B F Major and minor (any form).

- Only two scales will be played at this level, one choice and one drawn at random.
- Choice: One minor, = 60. Drawn: One major, = 60.
- 4 octaves in parallel motion in octaves, tenths and sixths, = 60. OR
- 4 octaves in octaves, tenths, and sixths, in grand form, = 60.

(**GRAND FORM:** 2 octaves ascending in parallel motion; 2 octaves out in contrary motion; 2 octaves in, contrary motion: 2 octaves up, parallel motion; 2 octaves down, parallel motion: again, 2 octaves out and in, contrary motion; 2 octaves down, parallel motion.)

**ARPEGGIOS**: 4 octaves in octaves, tenths and sixths, = 44.

**ETUDE:** One technically demanding composition from the standard concert repertoire.

**ETUDES:** Metronome is required for Levels I and above. Teachers should use the metronome marking indicated in the music or choose a similar speed which is challenging, but comfortable, for the student.

#### OPTIONAL FEATURE: SCALES IN RHYTHMIC VARIATION

In addition to the other awards, a special ribbon will be given to students who satisfactorily complete the Rhythmic Variation phase of the Tournament. To participate, the student should prepare two additional choice scales, using all the same rules specified for the level. This includes selection of scales, number of octaves, metronome speed, and standard fingering. At the Tournament cards picturing the rhythmic figures for the level chosen (one beat per card) will be drawn to determine the sequence in which the figures will be played. The student will be allowed and encouraged to watch the cards while executing these scales.

To prepare for this event, the student should make such cards at home, and practice the scales chosen in every possible combination of the units in the chosen level. (No figure will be used twice, no figure will be omitted, and no change will be made in the sequence once it has been established by the draw.)
